Who should apply for this course?

The course is aimed at mid-career professionals engaged in decision making, vulnerability assessment, climate impacts and adaptation, and policy development, especially in Africa.

What does the course cover?

- Concepts of climate change, vulnerability and adaptation
- Regional climate change scenarios, information sources, strengths and weaknesses of data
- Analyzing data for change and variability, developing tailored information
- Uncertainty, probability, climate envelopes and risk assessment
- Vulnerability, impacts and adaptation in key sectors (including water, agriculture, & the urban environment)
- Extreme events and threshold analysis

How much does it cost?

The course fee for 2012 is US\$2300. This fee includes all course materials, field trips and catering during the course. It excludes accommodation and airport transfers, which can be arranged and charged separately.
