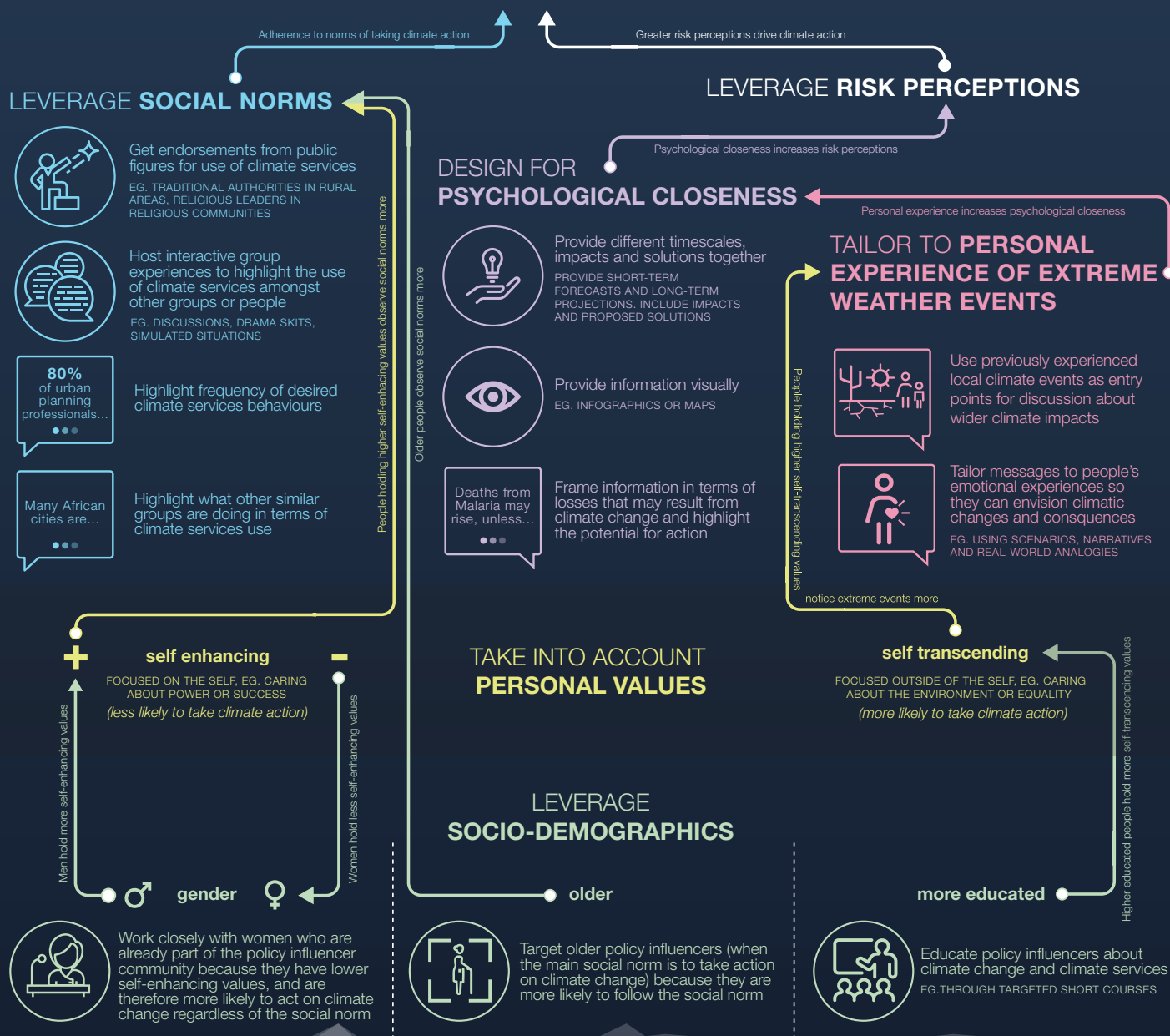


Designing Climate Services for ACTION



RECOMMENDATIONS TO NATIONAL METEOROLOGICAL SERVICES FOR ENHANCING UPTAKE OF CLIMATE SERVICES:

- Continue to strengthen local and international partnerships to build capacity in developing forecasting products, user-focused products and communication
- Act as intermediaries through which decision-makers can access climate change projections produced through a variety of international and regional modelling centres
- Develop country-specific guidance for how to use and apply these climate change projections, co-producing the guidance through user-producer dialogues
- Act as hubs for the centralised generation/storage of projected impacts information, produced through consultation with sector-specific experts
- Continue to improve the supply of observed and seasonal climate information, including integrating indigenous knowledge alongside more scientific knowledge
- Localise climate products, to provide climate information at finer spatial resolutions for more targeted action
- Continue making more types of climate information available, and "advertising" their availability
